- **Brief Description of the target groups:** members of the consortium, minister, officials, students involved in the French Holocaust ambassadors network.

- **Brief description of the event in English:**

This key event marked the launch of a joint declaration for the Young Ambassadors' Network commitment. The official signing took place at the Hôtel de Brienne, in the presence of all partners and officials, under the auspices of the French Minister Delegate for the Armed Forces, in charge of Remembrance and Veterans, Patricia Mirallès.

As the official launch of the project, we organized a partners' conference in Paris with the primary objective of formalizing our network. Over the course of a full day, we combined study visits to key French partner institutions — the Mémorial de la Shoah and the Mémorial des Martyrs de la Déportation — with breakout sessions and, most importantly, the official launch of the network at the Hôtel de Brienne, alongside French officials and other representatives.

The event spanned two nights and one and a half days. It provided the perfect opportunity to meet all our partners and strengthen ties.

We began with a private guided tour of the permanent exhibition at the Mémorial de la Shoah. This offered partners a chance to gain a deeper understanding of our institution and the history of the Holocaust in France. The first evening's dinner allowed for informal networking and helped participants get to know each other better.

The following day began with an official ceremony at the Hôtel de Brienne, hosted under the auspices of Minister Patricia Mirallès. This ceremony formalized our consortium and marked the official launch of the project.

The day continued with a private tour of the Mémorial des Martyrs de la Déportation — a site designed by architect Georges-Henri Pingusson — as well as their exhibition dedicated to the work of photographer Michael Kenna. This was followed by a working session and a meeting with former Young Ambassadors from the French program. Hearing directly from the alumni was an inspiring and insightful moment for all the partners involved.

We ended the day with a convivial evening at a typical French bistrot, which provided a warm and relaxed atmosphere to further strengthen our connections.
