Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

On March 29-31, 2023, the "the Holocaust as a Starting Point" seminar was held at NH Hotel in Trieste, Italy. It was co-organized by the Education and Teacher Training Agency (ETTA) (Croatia), the Institute of the Republic of Slovenia for Education (Zavod RS za šolstvo) (Slovenia), the Ministero dell'Istruzione e del Merito (Ministry of Education and Merit) (Italy), and the Mémorial de la Shoah (France).

During two days and a half, 51 participants have followed a training based on historical lectures, pedagogical workshops and a historical visit of the Risiera di San Sabba site. Topics such as the Auschwitz album, Mass deportations from the "Adriatic Littoral" to Auschwitz, or the Foibe killings were tackled, among others. 3 teachers from last year's training who volunteered to prepare the Learning Activity were invited to present their final work and to attend the training in Trieste.

The input regarding historical knowledge brought by the speakers was underlined by the trainees. We observed that the lectures created discussions afterwards and fostered interaction between the communities. The trainees found the site visit enlightening and the debrief session on the third day showed that they were able to build a critical analysis of the visit.
