Description			

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

From February 28th to March 2nd 2023, the "the Holocaust as a Starting Point" seminar was held in the Shalom Jewish Cultural Center of Sofia, Bulgaria. It was co-organized by the Bulgarian History Teachers' Association (Bulgaria) represented by Bistra Stoimenova, the Holocaust Fund of the Jews from North Macedonia (North Macedonia) represented by Goran Sadikarijo, the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs of Greece (Greece) represented by Vassiliki Keramida, and the Mémorial de la Shoah (France) represented by Bruno Boyer, Zélie Daull and Lucie Affronti.

During 2 days and a half, 44 participants were able to follow a training gathering historical lectures, pedagogical workshops and a historical visit of the Jewish sites of Sofia. In addition of these participants, 12 North Macedonians took part in the training as well.

The trainees generally underlined the input regarding pedagogical tools and historical knowledge brought by the speakers and they were able to build a critic analysis of the site visit. There were interesting interactions between the three nationalities, and some of the participants would have appreciated more informal time to discuss and exchange points of views, as well as a special time at the beginning of the seminar for them to share their knowledge, like a roundtable format.
